Dreadnought SPF100 Supporting Prisoners Families

This programme has been developed for young people and children aged 7 to 19 years who have a close family member either facing a prison sentence, in prison or being released from prison.

Aim

To provide non-judgemental support and unconditional acceptance to young people with a family member in prison. Using creative activities and sports to enable young people and children to better understand their feelings and emotions with regard to their situation. Providing clear factual information to empower children and young people to make informed decisions within their own lives.

One to one sessions

Giving young people time to talk in confidence to a non-judgemental adult.

Sessions are needs led by young people looking at the difficulties and issues they are facing by having a family member in prison; enabling understanding, building self esteem and developing coping strategies.

Sessions can be undertaken Countywide
